(3) Cousin Clare Hollingsworth of Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, sent a couple of notices in the Sports section of the Edmonton Sun. For Sept. 23, 1979, p. 41, under Hoofbeats, we learn that Driver-trainer PAT HOLLINGSWORTH drove Senga Evans to victory in the sixth race the previous day at the park. Time: 2:01.1. Hollingsworth said Evans, after a disappointing start to the season, appears "finally to be coming back to himself." Then, in the Mon. Oct. 1, 1979 issue, p. 35, there is a picture of Hollingsworth in an article "Evans was just perfect again" by Garry Cooper. Senga Evans won his elimination heat and the final for the 17th Western Canada Pacing Derby championship. He was the Alberta 2-year-old harness horse of the year for 1978. Hollingsworth brought the horse in in the first heat in a time of 2:02.2. The crowd numbered 4,278. The odds were 3/5 for Senga Evans in the first heat and the same for him in the 8-horse final.

Hollingsworth gives the horse the credit for "coming to himself" just in time for the Derby. But the owner, Ken Awid praised Pat him-

self for the months of training and patient work with the Derby champion. "Yes, I made some changes to help Evans along," said Hollingsworth. "Like about five harness fittings changes." Incidentally, Steve Schedlosky drove Hollingsworth's other half of his entry, Red Medicine, in the same race for third from a lOth post start. Clare Hollingsworth isn't sure, but believes Pat and Jim Hollingsworth are sons of Clare's dad's half-brother, or first cousins.
